
The programme is addressed to migrants, refugees and the general public



Multaka: Intercultural Tours in Athens Museums/archaeological sites

as meeting points

The word "multaka" means meeting point in Arabic. The MULTAKA programme aims at the meeting of cultures and the perception of culture as a common means of enriching human existence and coexistence.

-Where?

The Multaka program is implemented as a pilot project in museums and archaeological sites of Athens.

-Why?

Because museums and archaeological sites serve as a link between the society of origin and the host society, contribute to the mutual understanding and interaction of different cultures, help integration and participation of third country nationals and people with a migrant background in the public space and raise awareness in the local community.

-Who?

Migrants, refugees and people with a migrant background are trained by specialised staff of the Ministry of Culture and Sports, to carry out intercultural tours for people with a migrant and refugee background and for the general public.

-What is an Intercultural tour?

It is a journey through time and space from the perspective and experiences of people with different cultural backgrounds. Concepts with an intercultural impact are discussed, such as writing and communication, democracy and the ways to participate in public affairs, pre-industrial craftsmanship, commerce and economics, personal hygiene practises, the concept of death and of burial customs.

The purpose of the programme is to mobilize memories, experiences and emotions through the museum exhibits or the objects of the archaeological sites and to lead to the exchange of experiences and the awareness of the common needs that connect human communities.
